David Lorenzi, is an Associate Professor in the Department of Kinesiology, Health, and Sport Science at Indiana University of Pennsylvania (IUP), where he directs the Special Needs Activity Program (SNAP), which is a physical activity program for children and adults with disabilities. Recently, Dr. Lorenzi completed a term on the editorial board of the Journal for Physical Education, Recreation, and Dance (JOPERD), where he served as a co-chair along with being a former chair of the Strategies: A Journal for Physical and Sport Educators editorial board. Currently, Dr. Lorenzi serves as the Executive Director of the Phi Epsilon Kappa national honorary fraternity, the editor of the PSAHPERD Journal, and is a member of the SHAPE America Recognition Awards Committee. Dr. Lorenzi has received numerous awards for his contributions to the profession including the Eastern District Honor Award, the AAPAR Council for Aquatics Professional National Meritorious Service Award, the PSAHPERD Professional Recognition Award, the IUP Distinguished Faculty Award for Service, and the Slippery Rock University of Pennsylvania Young Alumni Award.
