# Russell Carson CO



Russell L. Carson, PhD, is an associate professor within the School of Sport and Exercise Science at the University of Northern Colorado and the Department of Community and Behavioral Health in the Colorado School of Public Health. Dr. Carson received his training in PreK-12 physical education, sport psychology, and health and kinesiology from Springfield College, Miami University, and Purdue University, respectively. Russ has over 20 years of academic experience across internationals contexts as a secondary physical education/health teacher, academic program abroad director (Italy '08; New Zealand '10, '16; Australia '14), and faculty member at Louisiana State University.

Since 2010, Russ has been a recognized leader of the comprehensive school physical activity program (CSPAP) model and the development of corresponding training programs. He has authored more than 15 funded projects (totaling \$1.5 million), has 45 publications (including Play On!, 2015, 2<sup>nd</sup> ed.), and has 65 international/national presentations in the field of education, most notably focusing on whole school physical activity promotion. He is a research fellow of

SHAPE America, the inaugural Chair of the CSPAP research SIG, and teaches courses in research methods, CSPAP, and grant writing.


